WHAT'S THE HOTTEST IN COLOR TRENDS

FOR THE FALL? First of all, we're going to see a lot more tone-on-tone colors with dimension. For example, blondes can be accented with either cool or warm tones of lighter blonde hues, such as honeys and caramels. The goal will be to bring out dimensions in the hair with, for instance, a rich, medium blonde color with subtle highlights or bold panels of a softer light blonde. A good way to accomplish this look with brunettes is to compliment with warm coppery hues or even a shade of red that flatters the tone. In fact, there's lots of ways to create this look with darker hair: deep, rich browns are wonderful with coffee and chocolate hues, and when you get into the dark, dark browns, it's fun to mix in cooler violet or blue hues.

BUT WHAT ABOUT THE HOTTEST STYLES?

There are certain styles that have stood out in certain decades through the 60s, 70s, 80s and 90s, and then been reinvented with a twist over the last two decades. But what is important for a great style is individualizing or personalizing your hair for you and your lifestyle by working with what your hair does best and embracing that, not fighting it. For instance, if you have natural waves, it's important to find the right product that brings out your best curl; if you have very straight hair, then don't fight it—go with a very sleek and simple style. In the end, if your style fits your lifestyle and your hair type (and you've got the right products to achieve your look), you'll have great hair!

HERE IS A STYLING IDEA FOR CASUAL WAVES, and believe it or not, you can achieve the look overnight. First, apply a gel or setting lotion to hair. Once it's dry (either air dried or blown dry, you'll get the most volume by blow drying), part down the middle, keeping usual front part. Then twist both sections of hair toward the middle securing into two buns. As you are twisting the buns, loosen up the top so it is not flat to your head, then secure the buns with elastic bands overnight. In the morning, undo bands and loosen up using your fingers as a comb to separate. Define the curls with either a shine serum or pomade and finish with hairspray. As you try this style, you can adjust the positioning of the buns by moving them forward (above ear) or back toward the part, or you can twist the buns toward the face—be creative!
